

s the exhibit comes to an end, the 58th Annual AGP Member's Show may not make the history books but I can tell you one thing, the caliber of art at this show has risen to a new level. I would not like to have been in the jurors' shoes trying to decide on awards this year, they surely

had their work cut out for them. Each year four artists are given Exhibition Awards and will have their work shown in the main gallery at next year's annual members exhibition. The jurors also select a number of pieces for a Merit Award, and if I found them all and counted right, this year there were seven Awards of Merits presented to AGP artists. So let us begin

with the Exhibition Awards.



I am in love with the fantastic color palette and the way the lines meet together in our next exhibition award winner's entry, Deborah Corsini, who presents us with a beautiful tapestry piece titled "Spring Romance".




open year round following our Art Guild member shows. They all proved to be successful. Featuring
